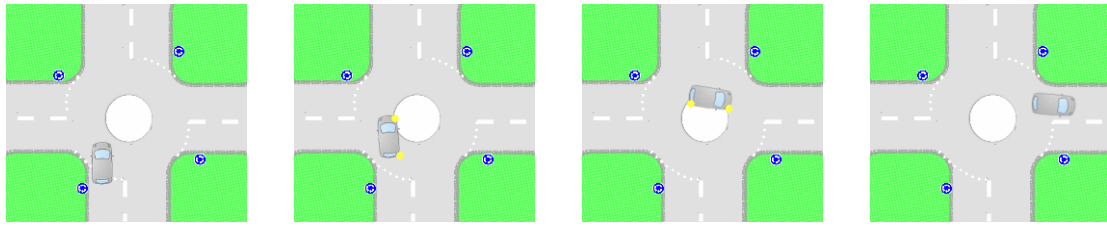


Mini-Roundabouts



Mini-roundabouts are often used as a means of slowing traffic down, or a traffic calming measure.

The rules:

- ◆ Give way to traffic on your right
- ◆ Give way to traffic coming towards you, which is signalling to turn right
- ◆ Wherever possible, avoid driving on the central island



Common Problems

Sometimes drivers will look the wrong way. If they have not seen you, they may pull out into your path. As with all junctions, glance to see where other drivers are looking.

Oncoming vehicles may signal late to turn right, or they may not signal at all!

The view may NOT be good to your right. Ask: [Is it an open junction or a closed junction?](#) If it is closed, use gear 1, and roll up to get a better look.

Large vehicles may need to cut across the island. Leave plenty of space for trucks, buses and articulated vehicles.



At Double-Mini Roundabouts treat each roundabout separately, one at a time.
